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FCC Adopts Landmark Agreement to Improve Access to Hearing Aid Compatible Cell Phones and Wireless Devices HLAA National Office

On August 4, 2016, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted new rules to ensure people with hearing loss have full access to wireless devices. As the FCC noted, the action taken "will modernize existing hearing aid compatibility (HAC) rules while maintaining the balance between fostering accessibility and promoting innovation and investment."

Upon the adoption of the rules, FCC Chairman Tom Wheeler said in his statement, "One area where the Commission has made significant progress in making sure accessibility is baked into new technology is hearing aid compatibility for new mobile devices. Today we take another step toward the day when Americans with hearing loss can access the same range of wireless handsets as anyone else."

The new rules will require manufacturers and service providers to make more HAC phones available to consumers:

- 66 percent of offered handset models must be compliant within two years for manufacturers of handsets, with additional time for service providers.
- 85 percent of handsets must be compliant within five years for manufacturers, again with additional time for service providers.

The FCC reported that it "reconfirms its commitment to pursuing 100 percent compatibility within eight years." Chairman Wheeler stated, "To be clear, we expect to require 100 percent compliance."

FCC Commissioner Mignon Clyburn noted, "I know I am in good company in saying that I look forward to the day when all Americans who use hearing aids have the same options as everyone else when purchasing a mobile phone."

HLAA was intimately involved in the collaborative effort that led to the groundbreaking <u>consensus</u> <u>letter</u> signed by industry representatives: CTIA, the Competitive Carriers Association (CCA), the Telecommunications Industry Association (TIA), and consumer organizations: HLAA, Telecommunications for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, Inc. (TDI), and the National Association of the Deaf (NAD).

HLAA would like to thank all the parties to the consensus proposal for their willingness to compromise and their commitment to finding a way to reach the goal of 100 percent HAC phones. We are thrilled to see our hard work codified into rules.

HLAA is also grateful for the efforts of FCC Commission staff, Chairman Wheeler and all the Commissioners in taking the consensus proposal from an idea to reality by drafting and adopting these updated HAC rules.

FCC Commissioner Jessica Rosenworcel said in her remarks supporting the new rules, "Hearing loss is a big deal." All of us at HLAA – members, staff and board alike, know only too well how true those words are. These new rules will give those of us with hearing loss greater access to mainstream products and services, thus giving us more tools to live well with hearing loss.

Special Chapter Meeting—August 15, 2016

A special meeting was held on Monday, August 15 to discuss issues related to keeping the chapter going. Primary concerns were the lack of attendance at general meetings, the burn-out felt my many long-time leaders, and the lack of volunteers to help with events and activities.

Main points from the meeting:

- Do publicity/ads in local newspapers and weeklies using chapter
- Get a Facebook page for the chapter and link it to website.
- Get acrylic holders for the survivor's manuals and place them around town.
- Develop a workshop and publicize it using the five point approach.
- The board should investigate changing the general meeting time (like to 5 to 7 pm).
- Make contact with local hearing aid dispensers to promote chapter.
- Contact various agencies and organizations (VR, Willamalane, Campbell Center, community organizations, VA, etc.) about publicizing the chapter.
- Emphasize social gatherings.
- Ask people one-on-one to volunteer and help with specific tasks.

Key Issue – all of these need volunteers/people to help do them.

Is It Time for a Chapter Tune-up?

HLAA National Office (Graphics not in original article.)

Signs the chapter may need a tune-up:

- Meeting attendance is low, declining, or static.
- The same people serve as leaders year after year.
- There is little interaction, enthusiasm and participation during meetings.



Signs the chapter tune-up worked:


- There is a turnover in leadership, every few years.
- Members are involved on committees or in some other activity.
- Membership is growing steadily and there are many inquiries about the organization.
- There is something educational and fun at every meeting.
- People generally feel please to attend meetings and feel they get something from the programs and peer support.



A Common Concern. The single most common concern all chapters

have is gaining and keeping new members and leaders. Engaging in outreach and publicity is the best way to increase membership. The most important committee to have, even if there are no others, is a Publicity/ Outreach Committee or a Community Awareness Committee. Below are some strategies you might implement:

- 1. Recruit all members to be part of a Community Awareness Committee or Publicity/ Outreach Committee.
- 2. Distribute meeting and/or special event announcements. Ask organizations that print community or service directories to include HLAA.
- 3. Prepare details about meetings for local papers and small community papers.
- 4. Ask hearing health professionals (audiologists, hearing instrument specialists, otologists, otologists, speech-language therapists, etc.) to help.
- 5. Use the Internet.
- 6. Encourage people to attend HLAA Webinars.
- 7. Seize opportunities to participate in community health fairs, farmer's markets, and similar local events.



- 9. Public Speaking.
- 10. Special Events.
- 11. Hearing Screenings.
- 12. Use a list of HLAA members in your area.
- 13. Form an Outreach Committee.
- 14. Create a Buddy System.
- 15. Contact Newcomers one or two days after a meeting to ask them how they liked the meeting.
- 16. Consider having social gatherings outside of regular meetings every few months.
- 17. Periodically evaluate whether the chapter needs a tune-up.

- "Face Me" Badge: There are 8 badges on each sheet. Using regular paper, it is easier to print the pages separately (not double-sided). Cut out along outside edges. They are designed to fit in a vertical badge holder (insert size 2.5 x 3.5) available at office supply stores. A different style can be used on each side of the badge. They can be fastened to you with an I.D. strap clip or a large safety pin. These are also very helpful when traveling.
