How to Live with a Hard of Hearing Person

In every relationship communication is a key part of maintaining and nurturing that connection. The more you are together the more important it is. Hearing loss is a major barrier to good communication, but it can be managed if both partners are willing to learn and help each other to make things work out.

HOH person:



 Understand that your partner probably spends a lot of time with hearing people so it is possible that he/she may forget helpful communication skills once

in a while - or even a lot. Try a friendly reminder before declaring war.


- Pay attention when your partner is talking to
- Don't expect your partner to be your "hearing aid" - He /she can help out in a difficult situation, but it's your job to do what you can.
- If you didn't hear something or it didn't make sense - say something - before you get upset!
- Keep your hearing aid by the bed. This is important in case of an emergency – or whenever you want to hear something else in the dark.

Partner:


- Try to understand what it is like to be hard or hearing. It can be extremely frustrating and irritating. Talk to other HOH people, it always seems different when we hear it from others.
- Try wearing ear plugs for a few hours during your day with non-HOH people to give you perspective.
- Don't take over for your HOH partner, but be willing to assist when asked.
- Face your partner when you are talking, you cannot be heard from inside the refrigerator or from the other room.
- Make sure the conversation has ended before turning away.

Both:

- Be aware of what makes things easier or more difficult and try to accommodate that. Don't pick the table in the middle of the restaurant when a corner booth is available.
- Talk about any problems that come up nicely.
- Discuss in advance how you will handle difficult situations - together.
- Work out some signals to let each other know if help is needed or not.
- Turn the captioning on the TV on all the time - and let the hearing partner set the volume. (Newer TVs have options to make the captions with different fonts, colors



- Record programs that you like to watch together. This way you can stop and re-play if you miss something instead of asking the hearing partner to repeat it -missing the next 3 lines too.
- Turn off background noise when you want to talk.
- Use an FM system or PockeTalker in the car, restaurants and other noisy places. It is worth the cost.

Annual Meeting Moved to February

The January general meeting was supposed to be the chapter annual meeting. Unfortunately, due to the weather, the annual meeting has been moved to the February meeting on the 9th. Two key things happen at the annual membership meeting: electing members to the Board of Directors and approving the annual budget. In addition, there will be discussion on an amendment to the Chapter By-laws with a vote to be held at the March general meeting (see below).

The current members attending the meeting usually elect people to be Directors on the chapter board from a ballot created by the current board. A person cannot be nominated without their consent.


- A board director must be a member of both the chapter and the national organization. (Scholarships available)
- The term of office is 3 years.
- Basic computer skills are required.
- Training will be provided to willing learners.

The board is supposed to have at least seven people according to the chapter by-laws. At this time there are only five active directors.

The current Directors have not been able to find members that are willing and able to serve on the local chapter board despite multiple requests for volunteers.

As a result we have no slate of officers for election.

Amendment to Chapter By-laws



VOTE

The Board has approved the following amendment to the Lane County Oregon Chapter By-laws and recommends it to the membership. It will be voted on at the general meeting in March because the membership needs at least two weeks notice before voting.

<u>Proposed change in bold text</u> <u>Article XI – Financial</u>

D. In the event that the chapter dissolves or ceases to function, the Board shall after determining that all liabilities have been paid, or that provisions have been made for paying said liabilities, donate all remaining funds to Hearing Loss Association of America, **Oregon State Association**.

Original wording

Article XI – Financial

D. In the event that the chapter dissolves or ceases to function, the Board shall after determining that all liabilities have been paid, or that provisions have been made for paying said liabilities, donate all remaining funds to Hearing Loss Association of America, Bethesda office.

Our chapter will follow the same guidelines for canceling the general meetings as the Eugene 4J school district. If the


schools are closed that day or close early we will not have a general meeting.
